Please include the following in your notice:

- 1. Identification of the material and information to permit us to locate the material, including collection name and URL.
- 2. Your contact information, including name, address, telephone number, and email address.
- 3. The reason why you are requesting the take-down, such as copyright violation or privacy concerns.

4. A statement that you are the owner, or authorized to act on behalf of the owner, of an exclusive right that is allegedly infringed and that you have a good-faith belief that use of the material in the manner complained of is not authorized by the copyright owner, its agent, or the law.

Upon receipt of a request, Out in Alaska staff will:

- 1. Promptly acknowledge the request via email or other means of communication if you do not have an email account.
- 2. Assess the validity of the request.
- 3. Upon request, we may temporarily remove the material from public view while we assess the concern.
- 4. Upon completion of the assessment, we will take appropriate action and communicate that action to you.
